2010: **4.2** % (2000: 2.1%; 2005: 4.6%)

2020: 10% and up to 50% by 2050

Electricity

2010: **12.5** % (2000: 6.2%; 2005: 10.2%)

2020: 20,0 %

Bio-Fuels

2010: 5.75 % (2000: 0.3%; 2005: 3.4%)





Electricity Generation (2005)






Structure of electricity generation



Final energy for electricity generation



Wind Energy Development




PV Development




Total Turnover RE-Industry (2005)




Job Creation / Employment Effects




Avoided CO₂-Emissions (2005)
