

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Overview


- China is firmly establishing its place in the global wind market after rapidly emerging in the last three years
- In terms of both wind asset ownership and turbine supply, Chinese players entered the global market in 2007
- An influx of foreign players coupled with China's near-term growth prospects points to the market's strategic importance as a global growth engine going forward

Wind's Strong Recent Growth Positions the Technology in the Mainstream




- ✓ Solid shift from Europe to the US and China for continued market growth
- ✓In the US, over 25% of new generation capacity is wind
- ✓ Strong regional diversification as China passes the 6 GW mark in 2008
- ✓Increasing regulatory support and improving equipment supply options is bolstering market globalization

The global wind market has surged in 2008, led by strong growth in the US and China




Chinese Utilities Among Global Leaders



Longyuan's and Datang's rapid growth places Chinese players among leading global wind asset owners


Chinese Suppliers Emerging on Global Stage

Global MW Installed by Supplier, Year-end 2007




- ✓Increasing focus on building order books in North America and Asia Pacific
- ✓ Proliferation of suppliers with multi-megawatt turbine portfolios
- ✓ Production capacity hub moving from Europe to other continents
- √ Chinese suppliers emerging in the top 10 (9% of total megawatts installed in 2007)

Over the last three years, turbine supply has evolved from a five player to a 15 player market, with an explosion in new investments as demand soars




Players Flocking to China's Scaling Project Opportunities



European and North American players are seeking to tap into China's long-term, large-scale growth prospects with multiple investments


China Becoming Key Piece of Order Books

China's Percentage of Annual Installations




- ✓ Eight of top 10 global suppliers have a manufacturing presence in China
- ✓ China represents 10% or more of global installations for leading suppliers in 2007
- ✓ Chinese players targeting export opportunities in the near term
